MWBC: Building Christian Character

Our primary objective at Midwest Bible Camp is to build Christian character in the young people we serve. We strive to provide an atmosphere that promotes Biblical principles and encourages spiritual growth in both the various daily activities and the times of meaningful devotion and Bible study. Our sessions are held at the beautiful Lake Darling Youth Center just west of Brighton, Iowa.

At camp, we take advantage of the lack of everyday distractions to make time for diving into God's word. Campers can look forward to daily Bible classes, worship times, and cabin devotionals. However, the highlight of everyone's week is the time spent at the evening campfire devotional! Some of our times of study and devotion are deeply introspective and serious, while others teach Biblical truth through nature and camper involved object lessons. Each session is unique, but all focus on cultivating a greater knowledge of God and the relationship he desires to have with us.

In addition to focused spiritual activities, MWBC also strives to provide fun relationship building activities such as games, sports, crafts, talent shows, skit nights, and a wide variety of week specific events. Every activity provides valuable times of fellowship with staff members and other campers. Lasting relationships are inevitably created.

We would love to have the opportunity to share with your child the amazing things that God can do during a week of camp. Come and take part in this amazing experience and see why campers look forward to MWBC all year long.

Bring a Friend - Get a Discount

We know that you love MWBC, but we also know that your friends will too! They'll thank you for inviting them to camp, and we'd like to thank you as well. For each friend you bring to MWBC (up to 3), you can receive \$10 off your registration fee. (up to \$30) To qualify, your friend must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Your friend must be a first time camper at MWBC.
- 2. Your friend cannot be a member of your immediate family.
- 3. Your friend must attend the same week you are attending.
- 4. Your friend must be listed in the "Bring a Friend" section of your camp application.
- 5. Your friend must submit their application at least 2 weeks before the camp session begins.
- 6. Your friend must not be attending camp on a Campership.

NOTE: The Girls Retreat friend discount is \$5. There is no friend discount for Boys Weekend.

Visitor Policy

Please notify the session director ahead of time if you plan to visit on Visitor's Night. (If you find it necessary to visit on another day, please contact the session director.)

Directions to Lake Darling Youth Center

ATTENTION:

Road repairs will require an alternate route to LDYC this summer. Highway 1 between the Lake Darling main entrance and Brighton is currently being repaired. Repairs on this section of the highway are expected to continue most of the summer.



Coming south from Washington into Brighton along HWY 1, turn right (north) on Ginko Ave. Then, turn left (west) on 315th Street. Continue until you reach Dogwood Ave. and then turn left into LDYC.

Coming east from Richland along HWY 1, turn left (north) on Birch Ave. Then, turn right (east) on 310th Street. Continue until you reach Dogwood Ave. and then turn right (south) which will lead you into LDYC.



Submitting Your Camp Application

*Please submit your camp application as soon as possible, preferably no less than 2 weeks prior to your session. PRE-**REGISTRATION** is greatly appreciated because it helps directors know how many staff members to enlist and how many campers to expect.



*Camper fees may be paid with the online application using PayPal or Venmo (additional \$6 fee), mailed to the treasurer at 1201 N. 5th Street, Clear Lake, Iowa 50428, or paid at registration on the first day of camp.

What to Bring to Camp

- Bible
- Pen/pencil & paper/notebook
- Enough suitable (casual, yet modest) clothing to last the entire session. Laundry facilities are only available in case of emergencies. Evenings can be cool, so bring ieans, sweatshirts, and a jacket.
- Modest swimwear and a cover-up to wear to and from the swimming area.
- Bedding: pillow, sleeping bag, or sheets & a blanket.
- Toiletries: toothbrush, toothpaste, soap, shampoo, several towels, etc.
- WATER BOTTLE with your name on it
- Flashlight & batteries
- Insect repellent
- · Necessary medications: All prescription and over-the-counter medications need to be in the original containers. Meds will be kept and dispensed by the nurse.
- Camera: remember that you won't be able to use your cell phone camera.

What NOT to Bring to Camp

- Firearms, fireworks, knives, or lighters
- Illegal substances, cigarettes/tobacco, vape, alcohol, etc.
- Cell phones, iPads, laptops, radios, or other electronics
- Comics, posters, or magazines

Servant Attitude Leadership Training

SALT is a leadership program designed to train the future leaders of Christian camping. Participants complete 2 weeks of training over 2 summers. The first week (SALT I) is held during Junior Week and focuses on counselor training. The second week (SALT II) is held during Intermediate Week and focuses on developing leadership skills, explores service in other camp staff positions, and provides further instruction in counseling.

Entrance into the program is determined after an application, reference, and acceptance process is completed. Applicants need to have finished at least the 9th grade. The SALT application in embedded in the regular camper application which can be found at www.midwestbiblecamp.org. (When registering for SALT I on the regular camp application, you will be directed to the SALT application) The application deadline is May 27th.



MWBC Health & Safety Policy

Midwest Bible Camp desires to create an atmosphere of peace which equally applies to all who participate in our camping experience. In the spirit of being proactive in its treatment of minors in our care, the following is a list of health and safety concerns for which parents/guardians (and if applicable local health and law enforcement personnel) will automatically be notified. Depending on the severity of the situation, the camper may be asked to leave camp so that their health and safety needs may be immediately assessed and treated.

- Any COVID symptoms
- Injury or illness resulting in outside care being warranted
- Fever of 100.4 degrees or more
- Loss of consciousness
- Vomiting with accompanying signs of illness
- Diarrhea (either 3 episodes in one day, or diarrhea lasting more than 24 hours)
- Observed self-harm tendencies (including self-harm attempts)

- Anaphylactic reaction resulting in epi-pen utilization
- Lice
- Animal bites
- Seizures
- Bullying
- Terroristic threats
- Stealing
- Intentional destruction of property
- Suicidal ideation/suicide attempt

Camp Fee Payment Information: Camper fees may be paid with the online application on our website (<u>www.midwestbiblecamp.org</u>) using PayPal or Venmo (additional \$6 fee), mailed to the treasurer at 1201 N. 5th Street, Clear Lake, Iowa 50428, or given at registration on the first day of camp.

Registration and Closing Information:

- Registration for ALL sessions is from 1-2 p.m. Please contact the session director if you cannot register during that time.
- Please see the table above to be sure you know when your session starts and ends.
- Campers, including those planning to attend the next session, must be picked up within one hour of closing time unless prior arrangements have been made.
- Campers who do not meet a session's age requirements will not be allowed to attend without prior director approval.
- Registrations are processed first come, first served. Please complete your online application at least 2 weeks prior to your session.

Cell phones, iPads, laptops and other electronics: To minimize distractions at camp, cell phones, iPads, laptops and other electronic devices should be left at home or turned in at registration. All items will be kept in the camp safe and will be returned at the end of the session.
